

Sufi Naqshbandi Uzbekistan Tour from Malaysia and Indonesia

Duration: 4 days

You will visit: Tashkent, Bukhara, Samarkand

Tour Itinerary:

Day 1: Kuala-Lumpur - Tashkent - Bukhara

Sufi Naqshbandi Uzbekistan Tour from Indonesia, beginning your journey in Kuala-Lumpur and arriving in Tashkent. Upon arrival, your driver will greet you at the airport and transfer you to the Railway Station for your evening train to Bukhara. Upon arrival in Bukhara, your driver will transfer you to your hotel for checkin. Experience the warmth of Bukhara's culture and hospitality as you settle into your accommodations and prepare for the exciting journey ahead. Enjoy a restful night's sleep in your hotel, energizing you for the adventures to come on your Sufi Naqshbandi Tour.

Day 2: Bukhara

Breakfast at your hotel before meeting your guide and driver at the

reception to begin your Naqshbandi Golden Chain Tour in Bukhara, a revered

holy land that has housed thousands of Islamic saints over the centuries.

- First, you'll drive to Gijduvan (40km) to visit the tomb of Abduxoliq Gijduvaniy, a prominent Sufi teacher and master of the Naqshbandi Order who received further training under Yusuf Hamdani. Here, you'll have the chance to pay your respects and learn more about his teachings.
- Next, you'll head to Shofirkon (20km) to visit the tomb of Khoja Muhammad Orif Ar-Revgariy, best known for his treatise on Tasawwuf/Sufism entitled "Arif Noma." Discover more about the life and legacy of this esteemed scholar and spiritual leader.
- After that, you'll drive to Vobkent (15km) to visit the burial site of Sufi spiritual leader Khodja Mahmud Anjir Fagnaviy, known for his wisdom and teachings in the Naqshbandi tradition.
- Continue your pilgrimage to the Mausoleum of Khoja Ali Ramitani, a disciple of Khodja Anjir Fagnaviy, in the Ramitan District (25km).
- Your final stop of the day will be the tomb of Khodja Muhammad Baba as-Samasi, the successor of Khoja Ramitani, where you can connect with your spiritual side and learn more about the Naqshbandi Order.

This tour lasts 8-9 hours and will leave you with a deep understanding of the rich spiritual heritage of Bukhara. After this spiritual journey, you will spend the night at a hotel near the Naqshband complex, fully immersed in the spiritual energy of the region.

Day 3: Bukhara - Samarkand

After enjoying a delicious breakfast, you'll meet your driver and guide to continue your pilgrimage. Get ready for a day filled with spiritual enlightenment as you visit some of the most revered holy sites in Uzbekistan:

• Your first stop will be the Said Amir Kulal Mausoleum, a Sufi author and poet, where you'll have the opportunity to reflect and connect with your spiritual self.

• The seventh stop on the pilgrimage ring, located in the village of Qasri Orifon (10km), is the Mausoleum of Khoja Bakhouddin Naqshbandi, the founder of the Naqshbandi Order, a must-visit for anyone interested in Sufi spirituality.

- Next, you'll continue to Sumiton village (22km) to visit the Chor-Bakr Necropolis, a complex of ancient burial grounds that was developed into a memorial complex in the 1500s. Take in the serene atmosphere and immerse yourself in the history and culture of the region.
- Your final stop will be the Mausoleum of Abu Khafs Kabir, the teacher of Imam Al Bukhari. This visit will provide further insight into the rich spiritual heritage of the area.

After this fulfilling day of pilgrimage, you will be transferred to the train station to take the afternoon train to Samarkand, a historic town that was once the seat of Tamerlane's ancient empire and a crossroads of the world's cultures. Get ready for a new chapter of your journey filled with more wonders and delights to explore. Overnight in Samarkand, your Sufi Naqshbandi Uzbekistan Tour from Malaysia third night.

Day 4: Samarkand - Tashkent

Begin your day with a delicious breakfast before your sightseeing tour of Samarkand, where you'll visit culturally significant sites that hold great historical and spiritual importance.

- Your first stop will be the Mosque and Tomb of Khodja Ubaydulla Akhror Valiy, a revered Sufi leader who had a significant impact on the spread of Sufism in the region.
- From there, you'll head to Gur Emir, the imposing burial site of Tamerlane and Mirzo Ulugbek, where you can marvel at the grandeur and beauty of the architecture.
- Next, you'll visit Khazrat Imam al Moturidi, the most venerated Islamic scholar in the region. You'll gain a deeper understanding of his teachings and contributions to the spiritual landscape of Uzbekistan.
- Your journey continues to Registan Square, the commercial center of Samarkand for centuries and one of the city's most famous sites today. The square includes three madrasahs: Ulugbek Madrasah (15th century), Sher-Dor Madrasah (17th century), and Tilla-Kori Madrasah (17th century), each with their unique architectural design and style.
- Next, you'll visit Shakhi-Zinda, a burial complex built between the 9th-14th centuries. Climb the bluedomed path and explore more than twenty small mausoleums that line the broad alleyway.
- Your final stop of the day will be a tour of the mausoleum of Khodja Daniyar, believed to be the tomb of the prophet Daniel, whose remains were brought here by Tamerlane.

This tour will last approximately 6-7 hours, leaving you with a deep appreciation for the rich cultural and spiritual heritage of Samarkand. After the tour, you'll be transferred to the train station to take the late afternoon train to Tashkent (330 km). Upon arrival in Tashkent, you'll be transferred to the Tashkent International Airport (flight HY553 to Kuala-Lumpur), concluding your unforgettable Sufi Naqshbandi Uzbekistan Tour from Malaysia and Indonesia.
